The queen bee lays all of the eggs. She lays 1,500 eggs a day.

What is the job of the worker bee and what gender are they? Worker bees are female bees that look after the young, build the honeycomb, collect nectar and pollen, and guard the hive.

How does a young bee get out of its cell? A young bee pushes itself out of its cell when it is fully grown.

Name the three stages a bee goes through before it is fully grown. A bee starts off as an egg, which then hatches into a wormlike larvae, which then are fed and grow into pupae. They then develop as a pupae and hatch out as a bee.




